Economic Development Characteristics	Your City/County
Estimated Unemployment Rate (%)	An estimated% of your community's labor force is currently unemployed.
People Living Below the Poverty Line (%)	An estimated% of your community lives below the poverty line.
Unbanked Households (%)	An estimated% of households in your community are unbanked, meaning that they do not use banks or banking instutitions in any capacity. These individuals primarily use cash, money orders or prepaid debit cards.
Average Wage (\$)	In your community, the average worker makes <b>\$</b> a year.
Firms less than 3 years old with fewer than 500 employees (%)	Of all the businesses in your community% are new, small businesses, meaning that they have less than 500 employees and opened in the last 3 years.
