The Tween Services Team serves children ages 9-13 and their adult caregivers. The primary goal of this team is to provide engaging learning opportunities with a focus on building positive self-identity, individual agency and lifelong curiosity. Caregiver engagement will be a secondary goal for this team in order to provide parents and supportive community members with developmentally appropriate strategies to support the development of their early adolescent child.

Team members receive training in adolescent brain development, connected learning, as well as effective caregiver engagement strategies.

The Tween Services team will achieve this mission through three areas of focus:

- 1. Inclusive and accessible spaces
- 2. Youth Voice
- 3. Self-Discovery

The activities listed on the following pages were gathered during our first team mission discussion in January, 2022. Our next step will be reviewing the activities in each focus area. Over the next several months, the team will work together to identify priority activities that fully support the outcomes for tweens, adult caregivers, and other supportive adults in alignment with the 2020-2023 Community Impact Plan.
